BASIC INFORMATION

Rules

1. This match is governed by current I.S.S.F. Rules and Regulations. All rules will be enforced on official training days. It is the competitor’s responsibility to be familiar with the I.S.S.F. shooting rules and follow all provisions thereof.
2. Warnings/Penalties will be given per the current I.S.S.F. Official Statutes, Rules and Regulations. Protest forms will be available in the entry office. A fee of \$25.00 must accompany any protest.
3. All shooters are expected to serve as sideline referees. If scheduled for the next round there will be a 10-minute break.
4. Shooting program schedule (i.e. changes of time or added information) will be posted prior to the match in the club house.
5. All competitors competing for positions on the SFC National Team, Development Team & Junior Program must participate in the full program.

Squadding

Match will be squadded by the selected Jury Members and Officials, to determine rules, field and play.

Format of this competition will be presented by the Head Official to the attending athletes prior to the Day 1 Match.

Doping Control

The Canadian Centre for Ethics in Sport (CCES) may conduct anti-doping testing and controls at these Championships.

- A) Participation in this match constitutes willingness to undergo testing if selected. (Reference I.S.S.F. Anti Doping Rules item 5.6.5)
- B) Procedures for testing will follow those established by the CCES
- C) Competitors or their Physicians may address questions concerning medication to (CCES) 1-800-672-7775 (Canada Wide) Email: info@cces.ca
- D) Remember that even over the counter medication can contain a banned or prohibited substance. Always check first with your doctor and the CCES anti-doping hotline before taking any medication prior to competition.

Selection to Shooting Federation of Canada Shooting Team

This shoot is the selection shoot for the SFC National Team, Development Team and Junior Program. In order to be considered and eligible for selection to the Shooting Federation of Canada National Team, Development Team and Junior programs, an athlete is required to:

1. Be a member in good standing of the SFC and be able to provide a SFC Membership Number;
2. Be a Canadian citizen; if naturalized, the ISSF international participation rule will be applicable (Article 3.6.0 Entry and Participation, item 3.6.3.3). Athletes must be fully eligible to represent Canada at the time of the selection trials;
3. Complete a trials entry form and pay the trials entry fee prior to the start of the competition sanctioned to select SFC National Team, Development Team and Junior Program athletes;
4. Sign a SFC Athlete Agreement and adhere to all of its conditions including the requirement to prepare and follow an annual training plan;
5. Not use or be in possession of, by medical prescription or otherwise unless approved by a Therapeutic Use Exemption (TUE), any drug that is on the World Anti-Doping Agency (WADA) Prohibited List or engage in any method or activity that would be in contravention to the Canadian Anti-Doping Program or World Anti-Doping Code.
6. Pay in full any outstanding accounts receivable owing the SFC;
7. Pay the annual SFC National Team, Development Team or Junior Program Fees according to final Team placing;
8. If not qualified elsewhere as per item 11. of the SFC 2011 Athlete Selection Criteria, shoot a qualifying score at the National Championships.

2011 Athlete Selection Criteria

In order to be considered and eligible for selection to team programs, selection match participants are required to shoot two rounds or twice through the course of fire, plus finals in each event for which they have registered.

Top six will shoot finals based on the total of the two rounds.

In the case of a junior aged athlete who makes the senior finals, the score will stand amongst the senior scores. A junior may not be excluded from any final for which he/she has qualified.

Finals:

2011 Athlete Selection Criteria, (i.e. paragraphs #24 and #29) - Finals in all events shall be conducted if there are two or more competitors.

In the case of a Junior age athlete who makes the Senior Finals in the **High Performance Team Trials** (HPTT) the score will stand amongst the senior scores – A Junior may not be excluded from a final in any event for which he/she has qualified.

Ties:

All ties will be broken according to I.S.S.F. Rule.

August 30th Day 1 Competition – 75 Targets
August 31st Day 2 Competition – 100 Targets
September 1st Day 3 Competition – 75 Targets (plus Finals in all events)

Women/Junior Trap Course of Fire Team Selection

Men/Junior Trap course of Fire Team Selection

Day 1 – 75 Targets

Day 2 – 100 Targets (split 50 – 50)

Day 3 – 75 Targets

First 50 of Day 2 will be added to Day 1 Targets for a Total of 125 targets

Second 50 of Day 2 will be added to Day 3 Targets for a Total of 125 targets

Canadian Trap Championship in all discipline categories is based on full program of 250 targets (plus Finals).

Double Trap

September 2nd - Official Training Day

September 3rd - Day 1 Competition - 150 targets

September 4th - Day 2 Competition -150 targets (plus Finals)

Canadian Championship Double Trap based on full program of 300 targets (Plus Final)

The 2011 High Performance Program will consist of a National Team, a Development Team and a Junior Program. No minimum number of shooters exists for the teams.

If not qualified elsewhere as per item 11. of the SFC 2011 Athlete Selection Criteria, **to be eligible for the National Team, a shooter must shoot the following qualifying score in at least one of the courses of fire at this match**

1. Trap Men: 115
2. Double Trap Men: 132
3. Trap Women: 64

If not qualified elsewhere as per item 11. of the SFC 2011 Athlete Selection Criteria, **to be eligible for the Development Team, a shooter must shoot the following qualifying score in at least one of the courses of fire at this match.**

1. Trap Men: 112
2. Double Trap Men: 118
3. Trap Women: 58

If not qualified elsewhere as per item 11. of the SFC 2011 Athlete Selection Criteria, **to be eligible for the SFC Junior Program a shooter must shoot the following Qualifying score in at least one of the courses of fire at this match.**
